TEENIE GENIE SUPPLY LIST

1. 7 grams of size 11 seed beads in main color
2. 4 grams of size 11 seed beads in accent color
3. 5 drop beads or fringe beads
4. Nymo D beading thread in color to blend with beads
5. Thread Heaven
6. Beading needle – size 10 or 12
7. Bead mat or tray
8. Lighting and magnification, as needed
9. Clear marble will be provided

RIGHT ANGLE WEAVE BRACELET SUPPLY LIST

1. 6 doz. Bicone beads or crystals
2. Size 8 seed beads
3. Silamide waxed nylon bead string
4. Size 10 beading needles
5. 2 jump rings
6. Toggle clasp
7. Lighting and magnification, as needed
8. Chain nose pliers
9. Scissors

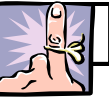

Motion to increase GLR dues

The Executive Committee recommends that the GLR increase the annual dues from \$1.00 to \$5.00 annual dues per primary individual chapter member and per plural member whose primary chapter is not in the GLR.

Rationale for the proposed GLR dues increase

Revenue generated from GLR's \$1.00 dues is not adequate to fund the duties required of the Great Lakes Region officers and volunteers or support its programs in a fiscally responsible manner. Therefore, the Executive Committee of the Great Lakes Region is reissuing its request for an increase in member dues. The motion, reiterated above, that will be put forward at the GLR Semiannual Meeting on September 24 in Indianapolis was officially published in the June 2011 *GLR Newsletter*. (View the newsletter including the full statement from the Executive Committee at the 2011 Annual Meeting online at www.ega-qlr.org.)

Within the *GLR Bylaws* and *GLR Policies & Procedures*, this organization has outlined the programs through which it endeavors to fulfill its mission to the needle arts as a non-profit group. It is a wide-ranging task that includes communication via the *GLR Newsletter* and the GLR website, support of EGA's Group Correspondence Courses, subsidization of education events such as the State Day Program and the GLR Study Program, the extension of loans for Seminar, and reimbursement of expenses incurred in fulfillment of the Region's duties and responsibilities to EGA and our financial support of the GLR Director as a member of the EGA Board of Directors.

The Executive Committee believes it is essential that we uphold our fiduciary duty to the Great Lakes Region. Below we outline the steps that have been taken during the past year to carry out our duties and responsibilities, and our conclusions regarding the results of our action:

- We cut line items and reduced allotments for programs and reimbursements, and then presented the Region Board with a bare-bones budget that does not cover the operational costs of the Region.
- We worked with the Seminar Review Committee to come to an agreement under which the Region would host GLR Seminar 2014 in order to secure additional income.
- Despite these efforts, it is clear that our expected revenue, generated from \$1.00 dues from an estimated 1,200 members, fundraising, shared seminar profits, and even the full profits anticipated from Seminar 2014, is not adequate to cover our expenses at the level necessary to carry out our mission as a non-profit organization.
- In past years, shortfalls have been made up by drawing on our reserves. In fact, even this year, the Region Board approved using up to \$3,000 from our reserves to support grants for State Days throughout the Region. We cannot afford to continue to take the "easy way" to financing our programs and our operations.
- The current scrutiny given our financial status and credit rating by the hotel industry makes it imperative that our reserve fund be adequate to meet the potential liabilities of the contracts signed by the Region for seminars. The consequence of not fulfilling the guarantees agreed to leave the Region alone responsible for those liabilities.

It is incumbent upon the officers of the Great Lakes Region to do our fiduciary duty in carrying out our responsibilities to the Region. Therefore, we ask again for your support of an increase to the member dues, reminding you that it is no longer possible for this organization to continue its programming at the level of dues established, and unchanged, since the mid-1980s.
