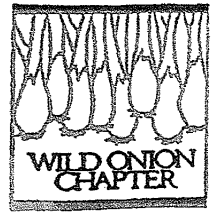

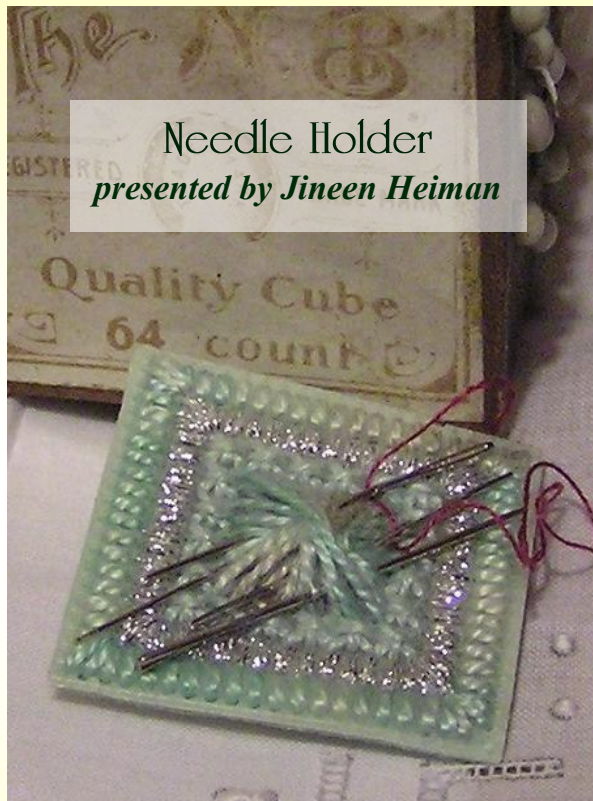

Potluck Recipes

Another of Judy's specialties, this delicious, refreshing dish has graced Judy's table at Wild Onion spring potlucks.

Mock Salmon Mold

- 1 can tomato soup, 10¾ oz.
- 8 oz. cream cheese
- 1 Tablespoon Knox gelatin
- ½ c. mayonnaise
- 1 large can tuna (or 2 small), water packed
- 1 large green pepper, cut fine
- juice of small lemon
- chopped onion (opt.)

Dissolve cream cheese in hot, undiluted soup. Add gelatin. Break up drained tuna and add to mixture. Add remaining ingredients. Pour into large mold and chill to set (at least 4 hours).
